



Munro of Foulis

- 1) Donald, progenitor of the Munro, lived in the time of MacBeath, the Usurper, between 1040 and 1055
- 2) George Bunro, or Munro, died 1101
- 3) Hugh Munro (Foulis), died 1126
- 4) Robert Munro, second Baron of Foulis, said to have married the daughter of Angus MacDonald of Islay, died 1164
- 5) Donald Munro, third Baron of Foulis
- 6) Robert Munro, fourth Baron of Foulis, married the daughter of Hugh Friskine, Earl of Sutherland
- 7) George Munro, fifth Baron of Foulis, died in the reign of Alexander III
- 8) Robert Munro, sixth Baron of Foulis, died 1322
- 9) George Munro, went with his father to the Battle of Bannockburn, where George died in 1314
- 10) George Munro, seventh Baron of Foulis, killed at the Battle of Halidonhill in 1333
- 11) Robert Munro, eighth Baron of Foulis, married Jean daughter of Hugh Ross of Rarichies, and brother of Queen Eupheme Ross. Robert was killed in a scuffle in defense William, Earl of Ross in 1369
- 12) Hugh Munro, ninth Baron of Foulis, married Isabel, daughter of John de Keith, second son of Edward Great Marshall of Scotland by Mariott, his wife. She was the daughter of Reynold de Cheyne of Inverugy. Hugh died in 1429
- 13) George Munro, tenth Baron of Foulis, married (2) a daughter of Macculloch of Plaids, died 1452 in a insurrection against the Earl of Ross
- 14) John Munro, eleventh Baron of Foulis, married the daughter of Sir ___ Calder, of that ilk, John died in 1490
- 15) Sir William, twelfth Baron of Foulis, married Anne, daughter of Lauchlan MacLean of Dowart, Chief of the Clan MacLean. Sir William was killed at Auchnaskeloch in 1505
- 16) Hector Munro, thirteenth Baron of Foulis, married (1) Catharine, daughter of Sir Kenneth MacKenzie, died in 1541
- 17) Robert Munro, fourteenth Baron of Foulis, married Margaret, daughter of Sir Alexander Dunbar, of Westfield, killed at the Battle of Pinkie in 1547
- 18) Robert Munro, fifteenth Baron of Foulis, married (1) Margaret Ogilvy, daughter of the family of Finlater, Died November 4th, 1588
- 19) Hector Munro of Foulis, married Anne, daughter of Hugh, sixth Lord of Frazer of Lovat, Hector died November 14th, 1603
- 20) Sir Hector Munro of Foulis, married the daughter of Hugh MacKay of Farre, Sir Hector died in Hamburg, Germany in 1635
- 21) Catherine Munro of Foulis, married (2) Norman Denune, Esq. who inherited all his fathers virtues, but little or none of his estate.
- 22) Mr. William Denune, second son of the first Norman, a man of parts and learning, and being bred to the church, was minister of the gospel at Pencaitland, in East Lothian, where he married Isabella, daughter of Doctor George Hepburn of Moncraig, Esq; by Helen his wife, daughter of sir Alexander Swinton of that ilk, and by her he had one son, George; and several daughters, 1) Christian, married to James Hepburn Congalton Esq; chief of the ancient family of the Congaltons of that ilk in East Lothian, without issue, 2) Mariamne, married to sir John Bruce-Hope of Kinross, baronet, by whom she had one son, John, who died in infancy, and a daughter, Anne Bruce-Hope of Arnot, who is now heir of line of the Hopes of Craighall, Bruces of Kinross, &c. Mr. William's other daughters died unmarried.
- 23) Dr. William Alexander Denune, the earliest southern colonial portrait painter, born 1699 in Scotland, graduated from medical school in Paris France in 1721, married Elizabeth Duvall, November 24, 1728, daughter of Mareen Duvall the younger and Elizabeth Jacob of Prince George County, Maryland.
